In the late 1960s,locals were expelled from Diego Garcia by the UK government so a joint UK-US military base could be established there. Islanders fear the Commonwealth could do the same at Cocos Keeling. "The government aren't going to spend \$500 million on a runway if it's going to be washed away," Graham says.
