Did Russia's renewed attacks on energy infrastructure damage Ukraine's nuclear reactors?

The agency said after Friday's attack that five of Ukraine's nine operating nuclear reactors had to reduce their power output because of Russia's "renewed attacks on energy infrastructure." The first reports of damage after the assault came from western Ukraine.

Why did Ukraine's Nuclear reactors reduce power output?

The International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA), the United Nations' nuclear watchdog, said five out of Ukraine's nine nuclear reactor units suffered "reduced power output due to renewed attacks on energy infrastructure".

Is Russia targeting Ukraine's energy facilities?

The facility has been repeatedly targeted by Russian airstrikes. Mauricio Lima for The New York Times Russia launched a missile attack on Ukraine's energy infrastructure early Friday, in an assault that President Volodymyr Zelensky described as "one of the largest strikes" on his country's power facilities.

Is the energy sector under a massive attack in Ukraine?

"The enemy continues its terror. Once again, the energy sector across Ukraine is under massive attack," Ukrainian energy minister German Halushchenko said on his official Facebook page. The extent of the damage had yet to be clarified, he said, while urging people to remain in shelters.

Did a gas attack target Ukrainian power substations?

An industry source told Reuters that Friday's attack had targeted Ukrainian power substations and that it had included more strikes on gas infrastructure than in past assaults.

Are Ukrainian forces repelled a Russian attack on Kurakhove?

Though according to open-source data presented by Estonian Colonel Ants Kiviselg, head of the nation's Defense Forces (EDE), Ukrainian forces have also successfully repelled attacks levied by Russian forces on the Donetsk town of Kurakhove, some 35 miles south of Pokrovsk, despite Russian attempts to encircle the town.
